

## (K) Roads

## (1) Policy

Driving surfaces represent a concentration of human activities within an aquatic environment. In addition to modification of existing surface drainage patterns, roads accumulate oils, fuels, and other chemicals. These materials severely degrade water quality when washed into a lake.

(2) Standards *rearranged*

- (a) No road, paved or otherwise, shall be located within the lakeshore protection zone ~~extended to within twenty feet (20') of the mean annual high water elevation~~, except as necessary to provide access to a boat ramp.
- (b) ~~Roads~~ roads providing access to a boat ramp shall be limited to twelve feet (12') ~~in width~~.
- (c) Asphalt or similar petroleum-based products intended for use as a road surface in the lakeshore protection zone are prohibited.
- (d) All paved, concrete, or hard-surfaced asphalt roads shall incorporate a drainage management and filtration system designed to remove sediments, oils, and other chemicals from the runoff prior to discharge into the lake.
- (e) All road surfaces within the lakeshore protection zone shall be included in the calculation of "Total Constructed Impervious Surface Area" allotted to each property.
