Lake County requires proper waste separation

Effective November 22, 2005, the Lake County Commissioners signed Resolution 05-46. The resolution provides for a minimum weight of waste materials that may be disposed of at no charge and describes where to dispose of different materials.

1. Wood Waste
 - a. Properly separated for disposal at Class III Landfill, as scaled at the Transfer Station
 - i. \$12.50 per ton
 - ii. No charge for the first 500 pounds
2. Construction and Demolition Debris
 - a. Properly separated for disposal as Class IV waste at the Class II Landfill
 - i. \$5.00 per cubic yard or
 - ii. \$25.00 per ton if scaled at the Transfer Station before landfill disposal
 - iii. No charge for the first 500 pounds if scaled at Transfer Station
 - iv. Non-scaled volumes at the Landfill under 1 cubic yard are no charge
 - b. Concrete without rebar separated for disposal at Class III Landfill
 - i. \$12.50 per ton
 - ii. No charge for the first 500 pounds
 - c. Mixed load disposed of as Municipal Solid Waste
 - i. \$10.00 per cubic yard when disposed of at Class II Landfill
 - ii. \$50.00 per ton if scaled at the Transfer Station before landfill disposal
 - iii. \$65.00 per ton when disposed of at Transfer Station
 - iv. No charge for the first 500 pounds at the Transfer Station
3. Supervised Record Disposal is no longer available.
4. Large Animal disposal at Transfer Station
 - a. \$65.00 per ton
 - b. No charge for first 200 pounds
5. Special Handling of Other Large Waste Volumes
 - a. Fee set by mutual agreement between Lake County and Contractor, Waste Generator, or Waste Hauler

The wastes listed above may not be disposed of at Lake County container sites. Violations will be actively pursued.

Disposal fees are due upon disposal, unless billing arrangements are made prior to disposal. Call 883-7323 for more information.

Use the following list to help separate your waste

Lake County Transfer Station

36117 North Reservoir Rd, Polson, MT - Open 7AM -5PM – Daily, except legal holidays

Class II wastes including:

- Household waste, garbage, and other biodegradable materials
- Dead animals
- Small amounts of household hazardous wastes
 - Such as paint, cleansers, solvents, pesticides
- Other Wastes as permitted – Contact Office beforehand

Recyclable items:

- Used motor oil and anti-freeze, lead batteries, tires, cardboard, newspapers, mixed and office paper, glossy magazines, aluminum cans, tin cans, #1 or #2 plastic bottles
- Metal disposed of at the Transfer Station – When separated and placed in the scrap metal pile will be at no charge, as this material will be recycled.

Class III (Inert landfill next to Transfer Station) wastes include:

- Untreated, unglued, unpainted wood waste or lumber materials
 - (**NO** plywood, OSB, or particleboard)
- Concrete (without exposed rebar)
- Rock
- Brick (Unpainted)
- Brush, tree trimmings, and stumps

Lake County Landfill

Class IV (Construction & Demolition) wastes including:

- Painted or treated wood (Includes plywood, OSB, and particleboard)
- Gypsum Board (Dry Wall)
- Insulation
- Asphalt Shingles
- Asphalt (banned from Class III Landfills)
- Large furniture items

Compostable Material:

- Grass Clippings, Garden Waste, Leaves, Manure, Crop Residues (go to compost pile)
